Beginning February 21, we will begin a Wednesday Evening Meal with Devotions.

We'll set up at 5:15 PM for a time to gather, share a lite supper, and carry on in conversation with one another. Individuals and families can come from home or work and be intentional about getting better acquainted with one another as one Family, First Christian Church. At 6:00 PM we will take time for a group devotional and prayer by our ministerial staff, elders, and even members of the wider community of Jefferson City. We **will** end promptly at 6:30 PM in order to transition to Choir and Bells practice. (*And who knows what other surprises are in store for those not in choir who may want to linger! You'll have to come to find out!! Ha!*)

You may ask why we are doing this? And maybe why at this time? Both are not only fair questions, they also show that you know your time is valuable. So do I.

I recently reached out to Brenda Foutes to express the gratitude I was feeling for FCC's Strategic Plan. The year before I arrived (2022), Brenda led a strategic planning team to make recommendations for the board and church to consider moving forward. One key recommendation was to "find opportunities to build stronger, genuine relationships amongst our congregational members and community."

Our **Wednesday Night Meal with Devotions** gives the whole congregation the opportunity to be intentional about building stronger, genuine relationships. The timing also seems to be right. From February 21 to May 22 takes us up to Memorial Day Weekend and is about 13 weeks. At that point we will stop for the summer, which will also provide time to evaluate before we decide to continue again after Labor Day in the Fall. We hope this feels like a manageable time commitment without feeling like it will continue forever.

So, we hope you will join in this time and consider inviting a friend to join you. I also think of Acts 2:42-44, where we find Luke's description of the heart of the early church.

42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common.


4th Annual February Baby Wipes Drive

Greetings, Beloveds!


