Pastoral Ponderings

God's Beloveds,

Wandering takes many forms.

We wander this way and that, choosing the winding path over the straight.

We wander away from places, people, and things.

We wander towards a hoped for future.

We wander because we are lost, and sometimes even when we are not.

We wander because we've lost our bearings or because we are waiting for something, or because we don't yet know the way we are called to go.

Wandering has been part of human experience since the beginning, and we find many examples of people wandering away, to, with, towards, around, in scripture.

These are the stories we will be focusing on during Lent this year, the time when we wander with Jesus to the wilderness and out again, until we find ourselves in Jerusalem at the cross, at the tomb. We will wander with Abraham, Moses, Joshua and the Israelites, brothers Jacob and Esau, Jesus and his disciples. We will journey with them as they wander towards the Promised Land, away from loved ones, and towards God. We will wander through the pain of exile and the pain of the cross while remembering that no matter the journey, we are not alone.

Our Lenten journey of wandering will begin on Ash Wednesday on February 17th. We will have two opportunities to worship together that day – at the church at 5:30 PM and at 7PM for a virtual worship on Zoom and streamed to Facebook.

During the season of Lent – February 17th through Easter Sunday April 4th, we will also be offering another opportunity to reflect on these wandering journeys in scripture.

This group of 12 Disciples is a strong cross section of our Congregation, with each member bringing a multitude of experience and talent to the Search Committee. They have my full faith and confidence in the mission they are undertaking. I hope that every member of our Congregation will pledge support for these 12 "searchers" and will actively pray for the Committee, the applicants, our future minister, and the Church. I strongly encourage you to contact any member of the Ad Hoc Search Committee with your thoughts and suggestions. Chairman David Durbin has called the first meeting of the Committee on February 4, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. I will do my best to keep all of you informed as the search process moves forward.

The Administrative Board also approved the names I presented for the Strategic Planning Team. The Team will be chaired by Brenda Foutes and will include: Meghan Hagenhoff; Blair Johnson; Herb Kuhn; Carson Lepper; Virginia Lister; Missy Mann; Allen Posz; Amanda Prouty; Nike Thompson; Steve Waters; and J.T. Yarnell. The Board voted unanimously to approve this team.

Community Ministry Affordable Housing Support Update

Volunteers Needed!

In late 2019, your Missions team with the endorsement of the church board and congregation decided to support work that addressed the shortage of low income housing in Jefferson City. That was done using money from the Community Ministry endowment that must be used locally in endeavors that involve our members in volunteer efforts. Many of our members volunteered as we helped construct a Habitat home as part of their Road to Recovery from the 2019 tornado. It also involved demolition of a 1910 property on Cherry Street that Transformational Housing will convert to a 5 unit apartment.

Both of these projects have been very successful. Despite the limitations imposed by the pandemic, we were still able to help complete the property that Loise White donated. The Harrison family is now living safely and comfortably in their new home. We also helped with interior demolition of the Transformational Housing property on Cherry Street, and it is now ready to begin reconstruction. They have already raised over \$250,000 of their \$400,000 goal to complete this property and acquire others.

In 2021, Missions has authorized another \$25,000 donation to Habitat and is considering additional financial support for Transformational Housing.

In addition to these financial gifts, we are once again asking for volunteer help from church members and friends for our "construction" crews:

Every Monday 8AM to noon - *This crew will initially be doing construction on the Cherry Street property with a goal of completion by the end of the year.*

Fourth Saturday of each month – *This crew will work on the Transformational Housing project and/or a Habitat home.*

Youth Update

How are participants in the LORD's Prayer Lab engaging with the LORD's Prayer? We spend our sessions focusing on specific sections of the prayer and consider its meaning for the authorial audience (those for whom the author wrote the Gospel). Then, we conduct "lab work" as each participant reflects upon and shares how they can apply our area of focus in their own lives. Youth with a copy of *The Teenage Prayer Experiment Notebook* by Miranda and Noah Threlfall-Holmes share their experience with a prayer from the book with the group. We close with prayer requests and by saying the LORD's Prayer together. It is an honor to facilitate and witness the connections being formed as we both learn from and support one another. 
