Congratulations! Alexis

First Christian Church celebrated Alexis Engelbrecht-Villafane's commissioning Sunday, June 20, by presenting her with her commission certificate at both services.

Alexis is the congregation's new part-time Assistant Minister. Her role includes providing small group ministry opportunities for the congregation, pastoral care, being part of worship, and preaching. She received her certificate to recognize her standing in the Region as a commissioned minister of the gospel. Commissioning is often granted to a minister by the Mid-America Region of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to those who are in the ordination process and serving a congregation. A commissioning certificate is often presented to a minister by the Regional Minister, Dr. Paul Koch, but he was not able to be at the service Sunday. The commissioning ceremony was conducted by Rev. David Avery, an elder at First Christian, who also serves on one of the Region's Commissioned Ministry Teams. David is also chair of Alexis' Ordination Nurture Team.

Alexis recently graduated from Phillips Theological Seminary and is currently completing the ordination process with the Regional Commission on Ministry. First Christian is Alexis' "sponsoring congregation" in the ordination process.

UPCOMING SPECIAL MUSIC

*June 27, 8:20 – The Forever Faithful women's sextet (Sandra Troutt, Laura Avery, Charlotte Middleton, Sherry Jordan, Karla Denny, and Carolyn Green) will share two anthems. The first is "Indescribable," a contemporary worship song by Laura Story which was first recorded by Chris Tomlin. The second anthem is an arrangement by Mark Hayes of David Haas' composition, "You Are Mine." The text of this anthem is a beautiful reminder of God's constant presence with us, especially when we may feel hopeless, desperate or overwhelmed.

*July 4, 10:00 (note time of single service!) -- Our choir accompanist, Scot Stout, will join me in sharing "Lord of the Dance," an organ/piano duet by Joel Raney based on the Shaker tune *Simple Gifts* which dates to 1848.

THE CONGREGATION IS INVITED TO A SPECIAL CONCERT to be held in our sanctuary on Thursday, July 1, at 7:00 p.m., as a part of the holiday weekend. Music to be presented is diverse and represents rich culture that creates strength, support and unity: *Sonata for Two Pianos* by Fred Onovwerouske, a St. Louis-based composer born in Ghana; *Rhapsody in Blue*, the popular composition by George Gershwin, son of Russian and Ukraine immigrants; and *Five Songs* by Florence Price, an African-American composer from Little Rock, AR, often noted to be the first woman of color to be recognized as a symphonic composer and the first to have a composition played by a major orchestra.

Performers include **Dr. Carline Waugh**, a Jamaican-born soprano praised for her ability to mesmerize audiences. As a powerful singing actor, Dr. Waugh has thrilled audiences around the world with recent performances in Russia, Finland, Italy, Austria, the Caribbean, and the U.S. FCC was blessed to have her offer special music on a couple of occasions when she taught at Lincoln University. She now teaches at Marshall University in West Virginia.

At the piano will be the married duo, **Dr. Peter Miyamoto**and Ayako Tsuruta. Award-winning Dr. Miyamoto holds
degrees from the Curtis Institute of Music, Yale University
School of Music, Michigan State University and London's
Royal Academy of Music. He has performed throughout
Europe, Asia, and North America and currently serves as
Associate Professor of Piano and Chamber Music at the
University of Missouri. Ayako Tsuruta has given numerous
concerts throughout North America, Europe and the
Middle East as soloist and chamber musician. She studied



at both Juilliard School of Music and Yale University and has held visiting assistant professor positions at the University of MO-Columbia and the University of Alberta-Edmonton. In addition to maintaining a private piano studio, she is Executive and Artistic Director of the Odyssey Chamber Music Series, Artistic Director to the Plowman Chamber Music Competition, and founder of the Columbia Music School.
