Pastoral Ponderings

God's Beloveds,

We have been wandering together this Lent and we aren't done yet. As we move ever closer to Easter, we are reminded that the journey to the upper room, to the cross, to the tomb was not straightforward.

It starts with a trip into Jerusalem. An intentional entrance designed to contrast with the arrival of Roman Governor who was surrounded by the trappings of power and war. Chosen instead a young horse, crowds with cloaks and branches. One who comes not to conquer but to proclaim peace.

It continues with a visit to the temple, with calling out corruption and abuse of power.

Then other plans begin to be made. One wanders away and makes plans for betrayal. Others are sent out to prepare for the Passover meal.

The conversation at the meal wanders – to what it means to serve one another, what is to come in the days ahead, to how those present will betray and deny Jesus.

In the garden, Jesus wanders away to pray as the disciples drift off to sleep. And the one who is to betray him, returns. Forgetting the path of peace Jesus set before them, one pulls out his sword.

It is a week of questions, of doubts, of confusion. It is a story of shortcomings and outright betrayal as the disciples – those closest to Jesus – find themselves struggling to understand, to stay awake, to put away their swords.

It is also a week of gathering together, of serving and being served, of preparing for what comes next.

Even when in the moment, what came next was hidden from view.

Tomorrow night we will gather on Zoom for our Maundy Thursday service at 6:30PM. We will gather at our individual tables that God will join together to make one table, one holy space, as we pause in our wanderings. At this table, as the disciples did, may we find spiritual nourishment to carry us forward into the days ahead. Into the grief and despair of Good Friday, the hopelessness of Saturday, and the bewilderment of Easter Sunday. *(continued)*

As we move towards Easter Sunday and the hope and promises we find in the empty tomb, let us also remember the disciples' journey did not end there, and neither does ours. Let us continue to follow, to seek the path God is laying before us as individuals and as a community.

April 1, 6:30 p.m. (Maundy Thursday) – Though the service will be virtual only on Zoom, a considerable amount of planning and effort on the part of staff and church volunteers has gone into making it happen. Rev. Beau's idea for service elements to be delivered "ala Blue Apron," while being described as fun and creative, is far more than that. With intentionality behind your participation, you will also find it a meaningful time of remembrance of the Upper Room and meal Jesus shared with His disciples shortly before His death, a reflection on Jesus' unfathomable love for others, and a witness to His servant obedience, even to the cross. Music, though pre-recorded, will nonetheless also be meaningful for this important week in the life of Christians. I'm grateful to Curtis Sudduth, Kelsie Slaughter and Jack DeArmey for sharing it with the congregation.

*April 4, Easter – Both services, whether at the church or at Riverside Park, will feature the traditional Easter hymns we love to sing, accompanied by a wonderful brass quartet, which will also offer "The Hallelujah Chorus." In addition, Forever Faithful ensemble, comprised of Sandra Troutt, Laura Avery, Charlotte Middleton, Sherry Jordan, Karla Denny and Carolyn Green, will provide an upbeat anthem. Sandra Troutt will also lead congregational song as we celebrate Jesus' victory over death.

Again, holding the service outdoors requires volunteers to ready the worship space by moving picnic tables and transporting, setting up and tearing down needed equipment and worship materials. A lot happens before the congregation arrives! I'm indebted to these volunteers, particularly my husband without whom I couldn't have accomplished what has been required to conduct worship during the pandemic.

*April 11 – Jubilant Sound Handbells will share two anthems at the 8:20 service as the Easter season (6 weeks!) continues. The group will offer arrangements of two favorite songs of many – the traditional hymn, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" and the contemporary hymn, "In Christ Alone." Beginning April 11, our talented worship team will resume playing weekly at the 10:40 service.
