# Pastoral Ponderings

Brothers and Sisters,

I am sorry to have missed worshiping with you all today. An unexpected medical situation in our extended family required us to be in Ohio for a few days, but I anticipate returning to the church on Wednesday. Still, there are three important updates I wanted to share.

#### **Congregational Meeting**

We will have a Congregational meeting on Sunday, March 14th at 1 pm <u>via Zoom</u>. The two anticipated agenda items are approving the 2021 voting member list and designating some unallocated financial resources. While we do not anticipate this meeting taking very long, we want everyone in the church to participate in these conversations and decision-making processes. I hope you will be able to attend.

#### Worship Plans

Our recent survey was very helpful but revealed a complex picture of views within the congregation: a portion of our congregation wants to return to the sanctuary, another group prefers to worship outside, and a third segment continues to appreciate the option for virtual worship. The Worship Committee has digested these results and suggested a plan for consideration by our Administrative Board.

While we are still working out details and logistics, it would involve a return to our usual Sunday routine of a service at 8:20 and 10:40 later in March. Worship for both services would initially be in the sanctuary with the necessary public health requirements (masking, social distancing, etc.) Once weather allows (hopefully beginning with Easter!), we would attempt to offer the 10:40 service outside. One of the services would be shared virtually as well.

There is no way to satisfy everyone, but the worship committee has done a tremendous job wrestling with all the dynamics of the pandemic and the needs of our congregational life. Please stay tuned for more specifics in the next couple weeks, and know that we will need help from across the church to realize these hopes.



#### Maundy Thursday

This year we will join Jesus in the upper room, not by gathering at the church, but by bringing worship to you. The week of Maundy Thursday all church members will receive a box containing several elements for an interactive worship service. Then on the evening of Thursday, April 1st, we will come together on Zoom to praise God and share in communion. We think this is going to be a really fun and meaningful way of observing this important part of Holy Week. So, please hold that night open on your calendars and watch for requests to help be a part of either packing or delivering the boxes to our church members.

### Search Committee Prayer Request

Dear Brothers and Sisters-

*The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.* James 5:16 (NIV) *[People] ought always to pray and not lose heart.* Luke 18:1 (ESV)

During this season of pastoral transition, the Search Committee and I would ask you to join us in an intentional time of prayer for forty days. The number forty has significance in the Bible. The number is mentioned 157 times in scripture. The Israelites were in the desert for forty years; Moses on Mount Sinai for forty days; Jesus spent forty days of reflection and meditation in the desert before beginning his ministry; Jesus spent forty days on this earth between his resurrection and his ascension. In that same spirit, please join us in forty days of prayer for wisdom and discernment by our congregation as a whole, for our Search Committee in particular, for Rev. Underwood and his family during this transition, and for the minister whom God has in mind for the next phase of our congregation's life.

We can begin whenever we choose to do so but if we begin on March 21st, the forty days would be complete on April 30th, the last day of Rev. Underwood's pastorate with us. The following table has suggestions for specific topics for prayer on each day.

His latest published book, a commentary on Mark for the Wisdom Commentary series received The Academy of Parish Clergy 2020 Reference Book of the Year, 2020 Association of Catholic Publishers first place award in Scripture, and the third place award for best new religious book series by the 2020 Catholic Press Association third place. I was delighted to be Dr. Carter's research assistant for his commentary on Matthew over the summer, which does not yet have a publishing date. I'm looking forward to introducing him to those who attend.


