Building Relationships - Continued

I'm writing this the day after the Kansas City Chiefs defeated the San Francisco 49-ers in Super Bowl LVIII in an overtime game that was incredibly played by both sides. Both teams left themselves on the field in efforts that took their all. It's hard not to like Kansas City given the trials and scrutiny they've received this year. I'll also note that it feels good to have something that brings us together when most everything else we hear is divided. For now, let's bask in the glow and enjoy the moment. Thanks be to God!

But that's not the main thing I want to share.

Heather and I've been working hard to think about this coming year. To be intentional to examine the year forward through the lens of much work that has been done from 2021-2022. In particular as that work relates to clarifying a mission and set of core values. One of those core values is **Fellowship**. We state that "We seek to build genuine relationships allowing us to encourage one another and strengthen our ministry together."

Most practically, Brenda Foutes and a team submitted the results and recommendations of a strategic plan to help guide ministry staff in working with congregational lay leadership. This during the difficult period of handling unforeseen ministry staff transitions. Not to mention beginning in the midst of a pandemic with all the push and pull that event brought to every congregation. It was bold and faithful for the planning team to step forward into that endeavor. We continue to press into the recommendations laid out for us as a guide.

Clearly, the need to build relationships is paramount in the recommendations. As the team wrote, we should seek "opportunities to build stronger, genuine relationships amongst our congregational members and the community." Their recommendation included efforts to create an "inviting" environment, staff relationships, and to identify potential points of connection upon which stronger, genuine relationships can be built.

Since coming to FCC and listening to folks, I hear in one form or another about the experience of attending for a while, but not feeling like they necessarily know others well. There's no judgment in that; just my sharing thoughts about the listening I've done and saying back what I think I'm hearing. This isn't uncommon for congregations, and the good news is that we can do some things about that!

One opportunity we're creating isn't necessarily fancy, but we hope it will create authentic time to get to know one another, even as we seek to understand our faith in Christ together. Starting February 21, we will begin a **Wednesday Evening Meal and Devotions**. Heather and I will be involved, of course, as well as inviting others from our community to share with us as special guests. Our theme for the meals and devotions will be Discipleship, since this is also a key element of what we're developing more broadly. Discipleship – the way we help form people to live faithful Christian lives as followers of Jesus – is ultimately the goal and measure of our ministry.

We'll start the meals and devotions on February 21 and end on May 22, before Memorial Day. So look for the details in this issue of the Bell. Details about signing up and the menu and eventually as we share your feedback about the experience once we're finished. We hope that everyone will commit to coming, being open, and find their place in the hope of learning something new.



Message from our Associate Minister

Hello friends!

In early January, I was officially approved for Ordination by the Mid-America Region of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ.) You are all invited to the service, which will take place at FCC in Fulton, MO on March 17th at 3 PM.

You might be wondering, "Just now? Hasn't she already been in ministry for over a decade?" The answer to both those questions is, "Yes!"

Up until now, I have been serving as a commissioned minister. Commissioned ministers are authorized by the governing body of their denomination (Regions for us) to serve in a certain congregation for a certain amount of time. If she or he is called to a new ministry location, they should ideally be "recommissioned" by the Region. When the Region ordains a minister, they will have spent a significant amount of time getting to know that candidate and they agree that the candidate has met all kinds of criteria for ordination. Candidates for ordination must complete a program of study (not necessarily seminary, but usually.) Whereas a commissioned minister is a representative of a specific congregation, an ordained minister is a representative of the Church Universal.

The ordination process is designed to take a while, because walking alongside people during the highest and lowest moments of life is not something to be entered into on a whim. During the process, a candidate must have the sponsorship and support of two congregations. That's the reason my ordination will be taking place at First Christian Church in Fulton. They have been my sponsoring congregation since I started this journey in 2013 and they are glad to do this one last act of sponsorship, even though they have already lovingly released me to serve you fine folks of FCC JCMO.

I hope this answers any questions you might have about my upcoming Ordination and gives you a peek into the larger process. If not, as always you can feel free to reach out and I'll be happy to chat more!

NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

<u>A Congregational Meeting will be February 18, 2024 in the Activities Room at 9:45</u>. This meeting is required by the FCC Constitution for the following reason:

Under the Constitution Active Members are defined as members who, in the last calendar year, have met one of the following criteria: (1) have attended Worship at least once in the preceding twelve-month period, (2) have made a financial gift to the Church at least once in the preceding twelve-month period, (3) are on active military duty, or (4) are considered a homebound member, and (5) are at least 14 years of age. Each January, a list of Voting Members, hereinafter, "Roll of Active Members," will be assembled by the administrative staff in consultation with the Board secretary, presented to the Administrative Board and approved by vote of the Congregation at an Annual meeting in January. The "Roll of Active Members" will only be updated throughout the year to reflect the addition of new Members of the Congregation as well as the removal of those lost through death, change in residence or transfer to another congregation, The Board will approve these changes, as necessary throughout the year. The Roll of Active Members will determine the members eligible to vote in all congregational meetings, except as specifically noted for issues related to the severance of the relationship between this congregation and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the liquidation or designation of endowment funds or financial resources for use beyond this purpose; or the selling of church property in excess of endowment funds or financial resources for use beyond this purpose or the selling of church property in excess of \$100,00(Article IX). Individual members unable to fulfill the expectations of active membership due to health or life circumstances, such as military deployment, may continue to be considered Active Members.

Associate Members are defined as those individuals who are Active members of First Christian Church while maintaining membership in another church or congregation outside the community. Associate Members maintain all privileges of Active Membership.

Non-active Members are defined as members who, in the last calendar year or more, have shown no measurable support of the Congregation through attendance activity and/or financial contribution. Non-active Members may be reclassified as Active Members in January of each year and returned to the "roll of Active Members" if the qualifications of Active Membership have been met at that time.

Please plan on attending this important Congregational meeting that will approve our list of Active Members for the 2024 year.




