Gospel Medicine

On the first Sunday after Easter, the church often encounters the story of the disciples gathered together after the resurrection. (John 20.) After Mary Magdalene informs them on Easter Sunday that the stone was rolled away, the disciples run immediately to the tomb as fast as they can. Indeed the stone was gone, and they found the tomb was empty. They were sure that the authorities had taken Jesus' body, a final deserrating insult.

Do you remember what the disciples do after the resurrection? Leaving Mary weeping beside the empty tomb, the disciples make their way back to the Upper Room where they had the Last Supper with Jesus. We find them after the resurrection together and huddled behind a locked door, afraid that the authorities are coming for them next, and sure that it's only a matter of time before they'll be arrested and tried as coconspirators who deserve the same sentence of crucifixion.

It's no fun to be afraid. To sit in your fear waiting for the hammer to drop, is it? I imagine everyone has known situations that felt like this.

Afraid while the medical test results return with news.

Afraid when your spouse tells you that things aren't working and maybe a divorce is the answer. Afraid of having to face the consequences of actions that have wounded someone deeply and caused someone's pain.

Barbara Brown Taylor has a collection of sermons bound in a book by the same title, *Gospel Medicine*. In it she draws attention to Luke, the gospel writer. It might be said that Luke never resigned his job as a physician healer. He just exchanged medicines. Instead of prescribing herbs and spices, hot compresses and bed rest, he told stories with power to mend broken lives and revive faint hearts. He uses gospel medicine that works strangely through words.

For the next several weeks leading up to Pentecost, I want us to think about Gospel Medicine. We'll look at some of our common ailments. Ailments such as abandonment, broken promises, greed and over-

consumption, loneliness and absence, and the constant threat of judgment and the apocalypse. Gospel medicine is about the healing power of God that is seen in the ongoing restoration of a broken world. Through Old and New Testament stories we'll see the power to mend our hearts, strengthen our weaknesses, and restore us to wholeness.

Message from our Associate Minister

Dear FCC JCMO family,

One of the things I'm called to think about in my service to this congregation is "connection." I think of that in terms of building relationships and strengthening the sense of community we share. Along that line of thought, this morning I started a book entitled *Called to Community: The Life Jesus Wants for His People. Immediately, I was greeted with a shocking and intriguing (to me) thought. In the book's foreword, Stanley Hauerwas begins by saying, "Community is dangerous." He elaborates that, in our social order, we "often confuse community with being in a crowd. And crowds are intrinsically dangerous."*

For Hauerwas, the thing that differentiates a crowd from a community is whether or not they share a "common story" and "corresponding judgments about what is true, good, and beautiful." This is a perfect starting point, I think, as we think about what makes us a community of faith, rather than just a crowd of people. What is our "common story?" What story brought us together and how does that story inform what we believe to be "true, good, and beautiful?"

The obvious answer is, of course, the story of Jesus of Nazarath, whom we believe to be the Christ, the Son of the Living God, and whom we proclaim to be Lord and Savior of the world. His story is the one that shapes our identity and our actions. His story helps us find meaning and make sense of our own stories. His story helps us decide together what we believe is true, good, and beautiful. His story, the Gospel (good news!) story of God's great love for the world is what makes us a community.

As disciples, we don't just believe his story, we become part of it. Isn't that cool? We get to be an active part of the story God has been writing since time began! How do you make the most of your part in the common story we share as a community of faith? As always, I'd love to hear your thoughts!
